Rector's Page: How Baptism Holds and Carries Us Throughout Life: An Inquiring Mind and Discerning Heart

Please note well, this is a theological discourse based on the presupposition that the give and receive below is within the framework of contemplative prayer. It is also noteworthy that this comes forward as an oblation during our holy observance of Lent, which prepares each of us to receive the gift of Grace.

Finally, take heart that I am sharing this teaching for all of us, but especially in honor of those candidates for Holy Baptism. Recently, at a spontaneous gathering of several families from our parish family I was given the opportunity to speak of sacraments and Holy Baptism as the churches initial entry point or sacred rite of initiation, as it were. What is presented below is a commentary on what was shared in person on February 21 during our impromptu 'Inquirer's Class.'

Quest 1:

Can we say that Jesus Christ was a prophet like any other prophets? Or Is there any difference between a prophet and Jesus of Nazareth who is the Christ (Messiah, "the one coming") and Son of God?

Response 1:

As Christians: We cannot say that Jesus Christ was just a prophet. There is a subtle difference between a prophet and the Son of God.

First, the concept of 'the Son of God' is not a metaphysical concept, but a metaphorical concept. It refers to the universal consciousness. It refers to the human consciousness that is united with the whole of humanity and of creation and lives for the welfare of the whole of creation.

There are four stages in our evolution of consciousness: 1.) an individual son of God or daughter of God; 2.) a collective son of God and the collective daughter of God (collective belief systems); 3.) the universal son of God or the daughter of God; 4.) union with God or realizing that God alone is.

The Son of God or the Daughter of God belongs to the third level.

Every individual son of God or daughter of God has the potential to grow into the Son of God and the Daughter of God, which is growing into the universal consciousness that is boundless and infinite love.

- 1. A prophet experiences the God of transcendence: The Son of God experiences the indwelling presence of God.
- 2. A prophet experiences being a creature of God: The Son of God experiences being the manifestation of God or incarnation of God.

- 3. A prophet speaks in the name of God: 'thus says the Lord': The Son of God says ' I say unto you'.
- 4. A prophet experiences the God of authority, reward and punishment: The Son of God experiences the God of freedom and unconditional love.
- 5. A Prophet tells what people should do and should not do: The Son of God reveals who human beings are in their deepest level.
- 6. A prophet demands the submission of 'will, intellect and loyalty': The Son of God gives back will and intellect and does not demand exclusive loyalty, but establishes unity.
- 7. A prophet establishes a collective group, an exclusive group: The Son of God breaks down all the barriers and establishes one God, one creation and one humanity.
- 8. A prophet writes on the 'tablets of stone': The Son of God writes on the sand.
- 9. A prophet and the Law go together: The Son of God fulfills the Law and the Prophets. He transcends both.
- 10. A prophet says ' the Law is the way, the truth and the life': The Son of God says ' I am the way, the truth and the life' and invites everyone to realize this possibility.
- 11. A prophet may create an exclusive group and have the mission of expanding this group through propagation: The Son of God sees that everyone is already in God and there is an essential unity of God, creation and humanity. He or she invites everyone to grow from the collective consciousness to the unitary consciousness with the divine.
- 12. A prophet may initiate a new religion or a new belief system: The Son of God does not initiate a new religion but a new human consciousness that goes beyond religious labels. He initiates universal consciousness and proclaims the dignity of human beings that they are greater than religions or belief systems.
- 13. A prophet asks the people to keep the Sabbath: The Son of God says, "The Sabbath is made for human beings and not human beings for the Sabbath."
- 14. A prophet says that the Law is the light for the people: The Son of God says, "I am the light of the world" and "you are the light of the world."
- 15. A prophet might establish a spirituality based on religion in which first comes religion, second comes God as understood by that religion and third comes a human being who has to worship God in that religion: The Son of God establishes a spirituality founded on God (the kingdom of God) in which first comes God who is greater than religions and human beings; second comes human beings who in their image and likeness of God are greater than religions and third come religions, as belief systems, which are meant to be at the service of human beings and not human beings at the service of religions. The Son of God transforms religions into nests in which human beings are born, protected, nourished and given security until they are ready to fly into the freedom of the kingdom of God.

Hence Jesus Christ is not a prophet like any other prophet. He is the fulfillment of the prophets. Jesus Christ does not give a Law. He is the fulfillment of the Law. He is the Son of God, the universal consciousness. He invites everyone both men and women to enter into this consciousness. The repentance or conversion that Jesus proposed is not a conversion from one religion to another religion but from the religious consciousness to the universal consciousness and ultimately unity with the divine consciousness. It is a conversion from divisions to unity, from 'I and mine or ours' to God.

This is an adaptation of a teaching received from my fellow contemplative, Brother Martin, OSB Cam. It is now for all of us to ponder over the next few weeks or months or lifetime.
